Our buildings and systems are designed, built, and maintained in compliance with American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE) standards. City and State building inspections demonstrate compliance.

We have assessed the risk of airborne transmission of the COVID-19 virus through Saint John's heating and air conditioning systems and determined it to be low however as a further precaution, plasma air purifiers have been installed in large capacity rooms. Additional purifiers are planned for future installation. The results demonstrate our decision making is sound.
