

The Delta variant is continuing to surge, and COVID-19 positive test results in Milwaukee County are increasing at alarming rates (positive test results have increased from 1.1% to 3% in two weeks' time). In order to protect the health and safety of the community of Saint John's, the following changes are being implemented immediately (unless otherwise noted) and will continue in effect until further notice.

Guests at in Public Spaces

Visitors, regardless of vaccination status, are welcomed to continue to attend community events and programming as capacity allows and gather in community spaces. However, visitors are not permitted to dine with residents in any community space or dining venue including The Bistro, Taylor's (effective Friday, July 23rd in order to honor reservations), The Chef's Table and care neighborhood (Windsor, Stratford, and Canterbury) dining rooms.

Visitors are permitted to purchase take-out from The Bistro and Taylor's for consumption in a resident's Tower apartment.

Tower residents with spouses or significant others residing in care neighborhoods may dine with loved ones in care neighborhood dining rooms and in the resident private room. Care neighborhood visitors who are not Saint John's residents may not dine with residents in dining rooms or in the resident's private room.

Because it is impractical, if not impossible, to exercise or swim while wearing a face covering, visitors will not be permitted in the gym or the pools.

Visitor restrictions also apply to private duty caregivers.

Face Coverings

Face coverings must be worn at all times by residents when in public areas.

Face coverings must be worn at all times by staff unless in their private office (or office suite if all staff members are vaccinated).

All visitors above age two, regardless of vaccination status, must wear a well-fitting face covering and physically distance from others while in public or common areas, and in resident rooms in the care neighborhoods (Windsor, Stratford, and Canterbury).

Thank you for your cooperation as we continue to employ strategies to prevent the spread of COVID-19, your support has been instrumental to our success.

We continue to strongly encourage all residents, employees, and visitors to be vaccinated. We continue to screen all employees and visitors at the Resident Service desks for symptoms of COVID-19.
